The enrolment process must be completed annually, before or at the start of each academic year of study throughout the duration of study with the university.

Use is necessary for UHI to comply with a legal obligation and undertake processing required by law (Equality Act 2010) which is in the public interest. That processing may include using the data to offer and provide support and assistance as appropriate in line with the Equality Act.

Use of the data is also necessary for a matter of substantial public interest, that being; identifying and keeping under review the existence or absence of equality of opportunity or treatment.

Certain courses require students to be members of the Protecting Vulnerable Groups (PVG) Scheme, which checks that you can safely work with children and/or vulnerable adults. This process involves checking for any criminal convictions or similar concerns that may influence your ability to work with vulnerable groups.

If you were to withhold the personal information we require for this process, the consequences would be that we would be unable to process your enrolment on your course. This would mean the university would be unable to deliver teaching or provide student services; your university account would be cancelled and any funding or bursary applications you may have made will be delayed or cancelled.

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With regard to courses that require PVG Scheme Membership, the university has specific duties under the Protection of Vulnerable Groups (Scotland) Act 2007. Should you be excluded from engaging with vulnerable groups you may be unable to participate in key aspects of your course. This may cause you complications if you have arranged funding for your course of study.
