- Ongoing commitment to support the Shetland Shellfish Management Organisation
 - SIC funding via SSMO £179,931 core research, additional projects £31,483
 - Operationally impacted by staff turnover and recruitment issues around merger
 - Unable to complete scallop survey and proposed projects funding re-routed to alternative projects
 - Recruitment currently underway for both Fisheries Research Assistants and a Shellfish Scientist

Aquaculture


- Development of Shellvolution Islands Deal Bid

- Exploring opportunities for postgraduate provision






Marine Spatial Planning
