Context

The Shetland Campus redevelopment Strategic Outline Case (SOC, reported to the Board TB2020-18) was submitted, reviewed and accepted as part of the Heads of Terms for the Islands deal signed earlier this year. We have continued to engage with both SIC activities and UHI activities and direct meetings with particular projects to develop our contribution to Islands Deal activities. Shetland UHI and the wider partnership have direct engagement or leadership of a number of Islands Deal projects as indicated below.

Islands Deal projects with direct UHI and Shetland UHI involvement and leadership:

- Shetland Campus Redevelopment
- TalEntEd Islands (pan islands skills and talent attraction project)
- Shell-volution (Shetland based aquaculture innovation project)
- Creative Islands Wellbeing (pan islands creative project)

Islands Deal projects where we will indirectly contribute:

- Knab regeneration (student accommodation, and creative space)
- Islands Centre for Net Zero (Transition lab)
- Shetland Clean Energy (skills)
- Shetland Space innovation campus (skills)
- Dales Voe (Orion) (skills)

Following the review of the SOC we were given general feedback which we are required to address in the development of the full business case. We are now embarked on developing our Outline Business Case (OBC) which is presented here in draft (SHET - OBC - draft v3 24_09_21).

The committee is invited to review and feedback on the draft. In particular three areas are highlighted for particular consideration:

- a) The Summary of benefits targets (p 14, Table 3)

 Are these realistic, sufficiently challenging, anything missing?
- b) The Qualitative benefit importance scoring (p 56, Table 24)

 Does the scoring meet with your expectations it is qualitative do you think it is pitched correctly?
- c) Section 7.2 (begins p.68) and Section 7.3 (begins p.72) on Programme and Project management arrangements

Do the management arrangement look sufficiently robust? Are F&GP content to receive reports in line with those going to the UHI Programme Board?

Next steps

Work on design needs to be commissioned and a brief is being drafted for that. This will provide costings for the elements presented here. We suspect that following this phase other funding will need to be sought for some elements of delivery.

The draft OBC is getting internal feedback with an aim of submission to SG at the end of October.
