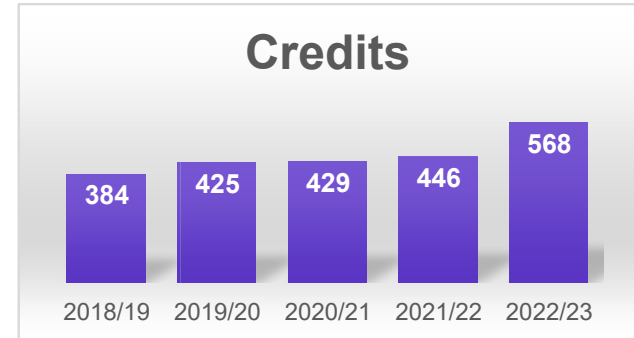
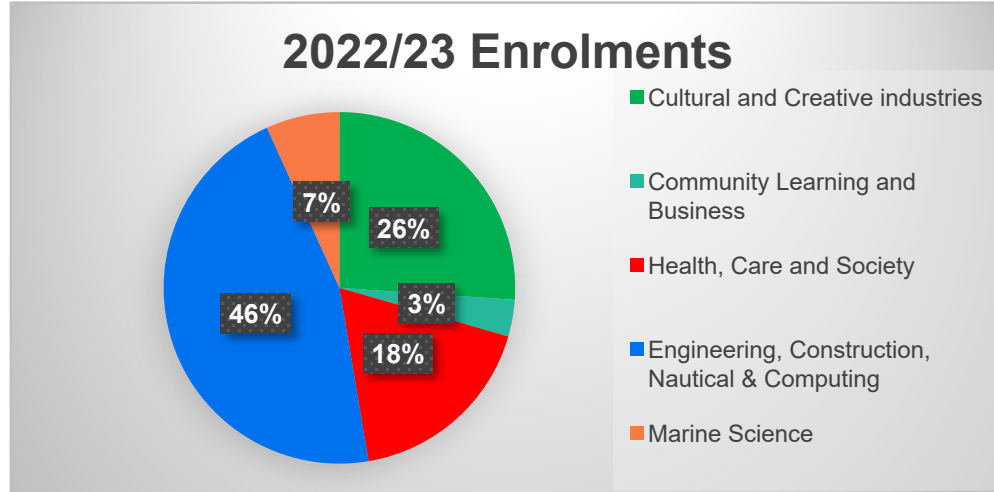
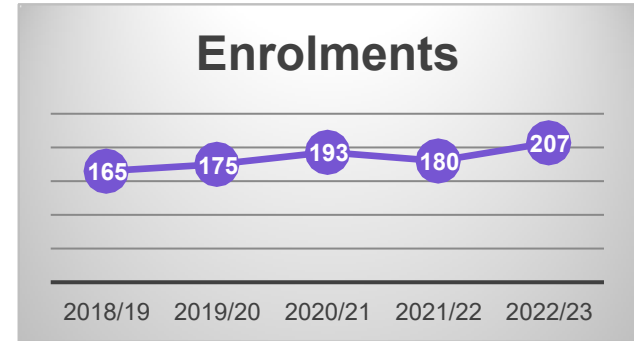

Vocational Pathways (Skills for Work)

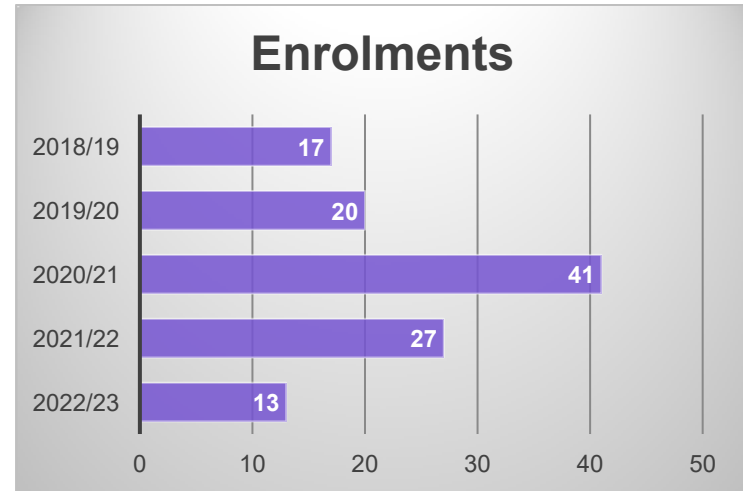
- S3/S4 students from all schools

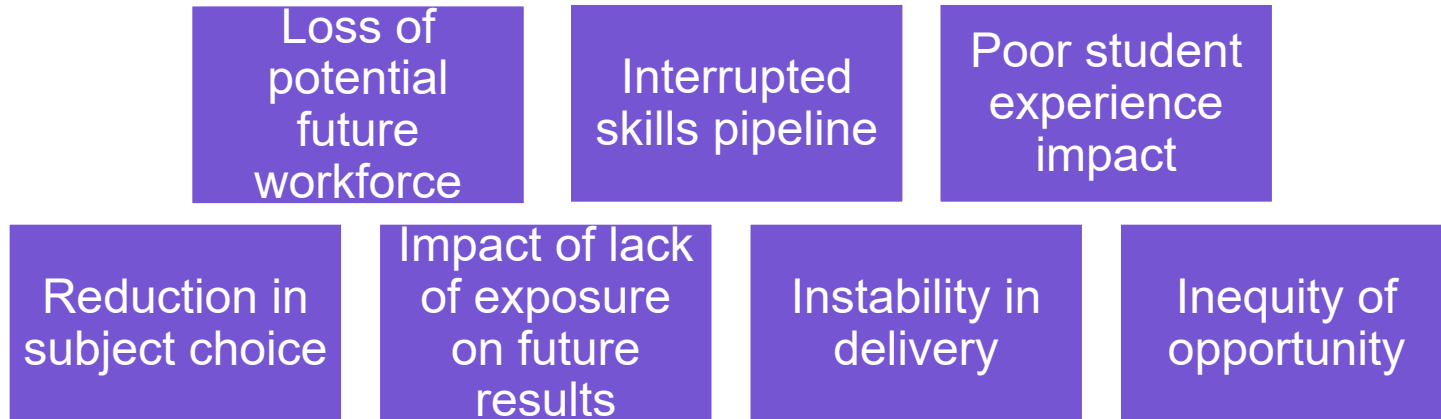

Challenge:- Shortage of technical teachers.

Associated Risks:-



Possible Solutions:-

Short Term

- Enhanced communication schools/SIC/SUHI.
- Teaching cover into 3 schools - Woodwork, Metalwork & Maths.
- N5 classes, Brae HS, NPA Construction.

Medium Term

- Delivering qualifications in/from college.
- S1/2 provision.
- Block delivery.

Long Term

- Attracting students to full time college.
- Teacher training.
- Enhanced college/school partnerships. Supportive strategic relationship.

Residential Transition

Accommodation for college can be a barrier for Isles residents.

School hostel offers secure, affordable and reliable accommodation.

Care Inspectorate specify must be on school roll.

Who could stay in hostel?

- Students on school/partnership courses.
- Christmas leavers for transition.
- Potential for bespoke course to accommodate 16-18yr old Isles residents doing college courses.
- PAH transition.
