

University of the Highlands and Islands National Student Survey Results 2023 - Summary

1 About the survey

The National Student Survey (NSS) is a UK-wide survey of final year undergraduate students, conducted annually by Ipsos MORI. The core survey consists of 33 multiple-choice items covering nine themes on appropriate scales covering positive to negative feeling plus an open text question. Each university has the opportunity to select additional questions from a number of optional banks. Responses to these are not compulsory and results are not published externally.

The survey questions and response scales have changed for NSS 2023. The changes include:

- a new 4-point item specific response scales will replace the Likert response scale
- a new additional question on mental wellbeing services
- a new additional question on freedom of expression, which was asked to students in England only
- the final summative question was asked to students in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland only.

The changes mean that most comparisons to previous years' data is not possible.

2 Headlines

- This is a very positive set of results relative to both the sector and our benchmarks.
- Overall satisfaction for UHI was 81%. This is above our benchmark of 79% for this question and above the Scottish sector average of 77%.
- While UHI's overall satisfaction decreased by 1%, the Scottish sector decreased by 2%.
- This places us 6th in the ranking for overall satisfaction in Scotland, compared with 4th last year, and still well above our historic ranking.
- We match, are **above or significantly above our benchmarks** in all but 2 (libraries and students' association) questions.
- We performed **above the sector** in all question sets bar Learning resources where we were only 1% below.
- Four programmes and two Academic Partners **received 100% overall satisfaction**, with strong performances by several others.
- The 67% response rate was lower than 2022 (75%) and is lower than the Scottish response rate of 71%.




Figure 1: NSS 2023 results by academic partner: % agree for question 28: overall satisfaction.




Figure 2: NSS 2023 results by subject network: % agree for question 28: overall satisfaction




Figure 3: NSS 2023 results by question set: % agree for question set.
